Protecting Health Care Workers from Violence

Two AHA-sponsored briefings on Capitol Hill draw attention to the bipartisan **Safety from Violence for Healthcare Employees (SAVE) Act**, which would make it a federal felony to assault a health care worker. In January, Rep. Dr. Larry Buschon, R-Ind. and Rep. Madeleine Dean, D-Pa. spoke in support of the bill. In July, Sen. Joe Mancin, I-W.Va, author of the Senate bill, appeared on a panel alongside AHA members to advocate for its passage.





Key Court Wins on Priority Issues

In August a federal court struck down a sweeping **noncompete ban**, agreeing with the AHA that the ban was "unreasonably overbroad" and that the FTC lacks authority to implement the regulations.

Working with our state, regional and metropolitan hospital associations, we developed model legislation and ignited a series of state laws to prevent drug companies from illegally denying us discounts for purchases under the **340B program**. We continue to help defend those laws in state courts.

Led by AHA General Counsel Chad Golder, we achieved an important legal victory to preserve the use of **online tracking technologies** that allow providers to share important health information with patients and the public.

Speaking Up For Our Members

Early in 2024, the health care field was hit with the most significant and consequential cyberattack in history. When the AHA learned of the ransomware attack against UnitedHealth Group's Change Healthcare, we took immediate action, reaching out to our contacts at the White House, FBI, HHS and Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency to provide information and secure support.

As UnitedHealth Group downplayed the severity of the issue, we responded aggressively to set the record straight, inform the media and testify before Congress. When Congress held two hearings with the UnitedHealth Group CEO in May, they held the organization accountable. Thanks to the advance work of the AHA and our members, the hospital perspective came through loud and clear. A few weeks later, we ensured that Change Healthcare, not hospitals, held responsibility for notifying patients of any data breach.

AHA helped secure funding and regulatory relief for the field.

At hearings of the Senate Committee on Finance and House Energy and Commerce Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations, lawmakers criticized UnitedHealth Group for its inadequate response.

In the weeks that followed, the AHA continued to work closely with the White House, federal agencies and others to enhance channels for the exchange of cyberthreat information, as well as provide resources for risk mitigation, including significant discounts on cybersecurity services from firms including Microsoft, Google, AON, Censinet, Critical Insight and Cylera. We also gathered and shared lessons and insights from the field, particularly related to cyber risk from third-party relationships. These resources are available at aha.org/cybersecurity.



Adverse events related to use

New AHA report paints dire financial picture for hospitals

A new report from the American Hospital Association finds that reimbursement is not keeping pace with the high costs of labor, drugs and supplies.

The 2024 Costs of Caring report outlined the continued pressures hospitals and health systems face. We maintained focus on the story throughout the year with the release of infographics on key findings, such as the impact of drug shortages on rising costs and a brief on the impact of AI on Medicare Advantage and commercial claims denials.



Between 2022 and 2023, claims denials surged by an average of 20.2% for commercial plans and 55.7% for Medicare Advantage plans, according to a Sept. 10 brief from the American Hospital Association shared with Becker's.







The AHA collaborated with members on the field's most pressing issues, sharing ideas, resources and information to drive progress on patient safety, equity and behavioral health.



An AHA report released in September showed that hospital performance in key patient safety and quality measures was better in the first quarter of 2024 than it was just before the COVID-19 pandemic, and that hospitals made these improvements while caring for more complex patients with more significant health needs. The report is part of the AHA Patient Safety Initiative, which we launched at the end of last year to reaffirm hospital and health system leadership and commitment to patient safety. 
